



What is it?

Derbyshire Sexual Health Action Research Project

A creative 12-month action research project covering Derbyshire including Derby City.

We have two main aims:

- 1. To find out about sexual health needs, and barriers to accessing sexual health services, especially amongst those people who have poorer sexual health outcomes, and
- 2. To involve staff, stakeholders and local people in how we find out about those needs and barriers.











What's involved?



Over the next 12-months we will be talking to staff, stakeholders, local residents and service users.

We will use a mixture of ways to involve people, including visiting groups, interviews, and group discussions.

This will be led by the research team.

Staff and Stakeholders



We want to help staff and stakeholders develop their research, engagement, and evaluation skills.

- Short online training sessions will share practical tips and approaches.
- Staff will be supported to try out learning across their own work.
- There will be a small grants scheme to help.

At the end of the project we will produce a report using the insight from the conversations, and share the learning across local networks.

People's confidence, skills, and experience of carrying out research and evaluation will also have grown. This will leave a lasting benefit across Derbyshire.
